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- The College of Education is comprised of four academic units: Curriculum and Teaching; Educational Foundations, Leadership and Technology; School of Kinesiology; and Special Education, Rehabilitation and Counseling.
- College of Education alumni total more than 30,000 graduates who reside in all 50 states and in 36 countries.
- The college is accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE). Many of our academic and professional programs hold accreditation, certification, or distinction within their respective academic disciplines.
- There were 92 active endowed and annual funds in existence during the 2013-14 academic year.
- The college offers short-term service-learning excursions and semester-long teacher education internships to more than 15 countries and on every continent but Antarctica. Service-learning excursions can take students to Australia, Costa Rica, Korea, Malawi, and Tanzania, while teacher education internships enable students to gain valuable experience in places like the Bahamas, Germany, New Zealand, and South Africa.

## AUBURN'S NEW 58,000 SQ FT KINESIOLOGY BUILDING SERVES OVER 650 STUDENTS

- *U.S. News & World Report* ranked the college's distance learning graduate education programs sixth nationally and its overall graduate programs 77th in its 2014 survey. The Rehabilitation Counseling program is currently ranked 17th nationally by *U.S. News & World Report*.
- The college's externally funded research and outreach activities totaled more than \$5.62 million for 2012-13. Such activities give students hands-on experience working with faculty in their chosen major.

Centers and Institutes within the college support Auburn's mission of instruction, research, and outreach. The following are included:

**Auburn Transition Leadership Institute** helps students with disabilities realize their post-secondary school goals.

**The Center for Disability Research and Service** focuses on the improvement of practices, programs, and policies aimed at helping individuals with disabilities live independently.

**East Alabama Regional Inservice Center** provides professional development for school administrators and teachers in 15 school districts.

**The Gastrointestinal Research Center** broadens understanding of functions and dysfunctions of the human gastrointestinal system.

**The Truman Pierce Institute** focuses on the study and improvement of teaching and learning.

**The Warrior Research Center** assists U.S. Armed Forces in improving soldier physical and technical performance.

**The School of Kinesiology** enhanced its presence on campus with the opening of the new Kinesiology Building. The 58,000-square-foot facility houses 20 faculty, serves more than 650 students, and is tailored for a unique assortment of research and outreach endeavors. Kinesiology relates studies in biomechanical and motor behavior, epidemiology and exercise behavior, muscle physiology, neuromechanics, and sports optimization.
