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• The College of Human Sciences (CHS) is proud of its reputation as one of Auburn's most vibrant, engaging, and intellectually stimulating academic units. In its pursuit of "Science for a Quality Life," the needs of individuals, families, and their environments are addressed by applying scientific principles to solve the problems of everyday living.

• The Department of Consumer and Design Sciences uses a multidisciplinary approach as the basis for designing interior spaces and developing, producing, and marketing textile, apparel, and related consumer products and services within a global context.

• The Department of Human Development and Family Studies focuses on how individuals and relationships develop and change in different contexts and over a lifespan.

• The Department of Nutrition, Dietetics, and Hospitality Management concentrates on the promotion of human health and well-being through good nutrition; the development, production, and use of safe, quality food products; and the provision of premium hospitality service to enhance the lives of families and consumers. The department's nutrition science option is an excellent choice for students wishing to pursue careers in medicine, physical therapy, and other health-related professions. The nutrition/wellness option is an ideal track for students who want to work in community-based health and fitness programs.

• Global Studies in Human Sciences is a new undergraduate major housed in the Office of Global Education designed to educate students on a

wide variety of global issues, the realities of globalization, and the interconnection between local and global issues. Content is drawn from topics relevant to the human sciences including international nutrition, food insecurity and hunger, microlending and entrepreneurship, environmental sustainability, maternal and child health, education of women and girls, global markets, humanitarian aid, and social policy. Students enrolled in the major must complete a minor in one of six designated areas, as well as a 12-credit hour global internship.

• Students experience the essence of CHS in its integrated core curriculum, international focus, and cross-college activities. Rigorous academic curricula bridge the arts and sciences, combine theory and application, and integrate global understanding and social engagement with technical competence. Outstanding faculty scholars instruct and mentor students, serving as a support system to maximize their personal and professional growth. Faculty require students to reach beyond the classroom to gain practical experience, an awareness of emerging trends, and a realistic perspective of their place in the world community.

• CHS students consistently earn highly competitive internship placements which often lead to full-time jobs. A sampling from the three departments includes: Kay Unger, Neiman Marcus, Nautica, Max Mara, Under Armour, Lucky, Four Seasons Hotel Group, The Ritz-Carlton, Capella Hotel Group, World Food Programme, Harvard Medical School, Yale Children's Hospital, Make A-Wish Foundation, and Alabama Public Television.

• The Joseph S. Bruno Auburn Abroad in Italy program is a semester-long study abroad experience based in the beautiful Roman hill town of Ariccia. The program is offered fall, spring, and summer terms and consists of pre-departure studies followed by 12 weeks in Italy. Upon satisfactory completion of the program, undergraduate students may earn 16 semester hours of credit and the International minor. Students can also earn class credit with short-term study abroad experiences in locations such as South Africa, Fiji, the Bahamas, Peru, Jordan, and other parts of Europe and Asia, as well as domestic study tours in New York City and Napa Valley.

• CHS students play a leading role campus-wide in the Auburn University War on Hunger campaign and internationally as part of Universities Fighting World Hunger. The multidisciplinary Hunger Studies minor is offered through the college and is available to all students on campus, regardless of major.

• A minor in Philanthropy and Nonprofit Studies is available through the Department of Consumer and Design Sciences. This credential is offered in conjunction with the Cary Center for the Advancement of Philanthropy and Nonprofit Studies and is open to all majors.

• Eligible students in Apparel Merchandise, Design, and Production Management and in Nutrition have the opportunity to enroll in the Accelerated Bachelor's/Master's Degree program (ABM).
