- The College of Liberal Arts provides a wide range of opportunities to students through its 12 departments and the School of Communication and Journalism that encompass four academic areas: fine arts, social sciences, communication, and humanities.
- Liberal Arts graduates are highly employable with 73.25% of our graduates employed or pursuing further education within six months of graduation.
- The Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures offers study abroad opportunities in Austria, China, Costa Rica, France, Italy, and Spain. A new semester-long, credit-earning internship program begins this fall in Seville, Spain.
- The College of Liberal Arts offers new graduate certificates in Communication Studies, Technical Communication, Archival Studies, Public History, Elections Administration, and Nonprofit Organizations and Community Governance.
- The Department of Psychology provides thousands of hours of outreach and clinical services to the public through its fully functioning Psychological Services Center and volunteer program Project Uplift.
- The Department of Music is an accredited institutional member of the National Association of Schools of Music and offers an impressive number of instrumental, chamber, and vocal ensembles.
- The college houses the Women's Leadership Institute (WLI) which provides intensive leadership training to a diverse group of students across all disciplines of study.
- The School of Communication and Journalism is home to four programs: Communication, Journalism, Public Relations, and Media Studies.
- The Health Services Administration program placed 100% of its graduates in health care professions or graduate schools in 2013. Several new professional internship opportunities are in the works in locations such as Dublin, Australia, and the Czech Republic.
- The Department of Theatre offers impressive, diverse, and professional-quality performances which are free to students.
- The Pre-Law Scholars Program offers its students career counseling, law school application counseling, and numerous networking opportunities with attorneys and judges.
- The Bioanthropology Lab in the Department of Sociology, Anthropology, and Social Work provides student opportunities for extensive training and experience in human biological variation, field and lab methodologies, and human evolution. The Anthropology faculty hold expertise in sociocultural anthropology, archaeology, and biological anthropology, with specializations in the environment, medicine, gender and kinship, migration, and southeastern archaeology.
