- A continuous program since 1892, the College of Veterinary Medicine is the oldest in the South and the seventh oldest in the nation. More than 6,428 doctors of veterinary medicine have graduated since the first degrees were officially awarded in 1909.
- The Biomedical Sciences Graduate Program leads to both the master of science (MS) and doctor of philosophy (PhD) degrees in biomedical sciences.
- More than 90% of enrolled students earn bachelor's or master's degrees before being accepted. In 2014, students received more than \$700,000 in scholarships.
- A four-year curriculum trains students for diverse career opportunities, including private practice, biomedical research, and public health.
- Auburn is one of the few veterinary colleges requiring seniors to spend at least eight weeks with a practicing veterinarian before graduation.
- The Merial Veterinary Scholars Program provides a high-quality research experience for selected freshman and sophomore veterinary students and helps introduce the possibility of a career in biomedical research. Mentors are chosen from among Auburn's internationally recognized faculty members and scientists.
- Through externships and foundation-sponsored trips, students have opportunities to travel and focus on veterinary work worldwide. These trips allow students to see veterinary medicine from a variety of national perspectives. A veterinarian with this international exposure will have more experience in identifying a foreign animal disease to halt the spread of the disease in our food system.
- The college has enhanced its facilities and programs with an infrastructure investment of \$74 million. The new Wilford and Kate Bailey Small Animal Teaching Hospital and expanded Veterinary Education Center provide ideal environments for innovations in education, clinical research, and animal healthcare.
- Auburn is one of the few veterinary programs in the U.S. with access to 3 Tesla and 7 Tesla MRI facilities for use in research and special clinical cases.
- The college is the home of Auburn's renowned Southeastern Raptor Center, which rehabilitates birds of prey and educates the public about them.
- The Animal Health and Performance Program partners with the AMK9 Academy to produce the industry-leading Vapor Wake™ detector dog.
