- Students are prepared for diverse careers in natural resources, including forest and wildlife management, environmental law, nature-based recreation, conservation, consulting, procurement, investment, research, and education.
- The Natural Resources Management degree can be paired with any minor on campus to tailor a career path in a number of fast-growing outdoor and nature-based careers.
- Undergraduate students have the opportunity to participate in hands-on research with innovative professors in forestry and wildlife.
- Research centers include the Alabama Cooperative Fish and Wildlife Research Unit, the Center for Longleaf Pine Ecosystems, the Center for Forest Sustainability, the Auburn University Southern Forestry Nursery Management Cooperative, the Forest Engineering Center, the Forest Products Development Center, the Forest Health Cooperative, and the Forest Policy Center.
- The Solon Dixon Forestry Education Center near Andalusia, AL offers classroom and living accommodations and a 5,300-acre outdoor classroom for the benefit of students and visitors.
- Each forestry student spends a summer term at the Solon Dixon Center taking basic field forestry coursework prior to the junior year. A six-week practicum program for wildlife students began in summer 2012. During the practicum experience, students learn the hands-on techniques that are critical in preparing for their career choices.
- The average scholarship amount awarded by the School of Forestry and Wildlife Sciences per student is approximately \$1,400.
