





TUITION AND FINANCIAL AID


Wayne State is one of Michigan's greatest values — a major research university with tuition rates among the lowest in the state. In addition to tuition, you also need to consider living expenses, transportation, books and supplies when crunching the numbers. The investment you're about to make in your future is substantial — but worthwhile. Wayne State offers a range of ways to help make it manageable.

Getting started

Everyone's first step — regardless of income — is to file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid at fafsa.gov beginning October 1 for the following academic year, using WSU code 002329.

Types of aid

Four main types of aid may be offered to you in any combination:

- **Grants** are based on financial need and do not require repayment. Wayne State automatically reviews each student's FAFSA to determine grant qualification.
- **Scholarships** are awarded for special achievement or circumstances and do not require repayment. Each student's academic credentials are automatically reviewed for WSU merit award consideration upon admission.
- **Work-study positions** are an opportunity to earn financial aid through employment. Awards are based on need.
- **Loans** must be repaid after graduation. Federal student loans are funded by the government and can be subsidized (based on financial need, with the government paying the interest), unsubsidized (no requirement to demonstrate need, and students pay the interest) or Parent PLUS (parents borrow federal loans to assist with college costs).

Merit scholarships

Wayne State University offers a range of awards to qualified incoming freshmen based on a number of factors, including GPA, standardized test scores and application materials. Eligible students are automatically considered for merit scholarships. For details and links to external award programs, visit wayne.edu/scholarships.

Need-based scholarships

The Wayne Access Award and the Wayne State Promise Award are two ways that WSU helps students cover the cost of tuition in combination with federal, state and institutional aid. Eligible students are automatically considered for these awards. For details, visit wayne.edu/financial-aid.
