

A new choice for a better tomorrow: Transferring to Chatham

1. Apply online at apply.chatham.edu/ugrad
2. Gather and submit the following materials:
 - Official academic transcripts from all past colleges/universities in which you were enrolled
 - Official high school transcripts
 - Essay or writing sample
 - One or more letters of recommendation from a professor, community member, employer, etc.
 - SAT (Chatham code: 2081) or ACT (Chatham code: 3538) scores

Note: *If you have more than 24 transferrable credits, you don't need to provide high school transcript or test scores.*

If you choose not to submit test scores, in addition to the items listed above, you may do the following:

- Complete an on-campus interview
- Submit the following materials:
 - Resume
 - Graded academic writing sample
 - Portfolio (optional)

If you feel that these materials do not adequately represent your academic abilities or explain your academic history, feel free to submit additional explanatory materials to strengthen your application.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Over 1/3 of Chatham's undergraduate student body are transfer students.
- Chatham's **generous transfer credit policy** allows students to transfer in up to 90 credits.
- Chatham's **completion degree programs** offer flexibility through night, weekend, and online courses for working students.
